INFORMATION & REPORTS –

A. Report: Coffee Chats and Curriculum Night

Mr. Owen shared that the Coffee Chats will resume for the second semester. We have scheduled three dates: March 31 at KECLC, April 17 at Southeast and April 18 at the High School. Our goal is to increase attendance and encourage parents to make these events a regular part of their schedule. Additionally, we are excited to host our first Curriculum Night, which will highlight what is happening in our classrooms. This event will be marketed to the entire Kelloggsville Community. The theme is “Travel around Kelloggsville.” Attendees will receive a passport and they will earn a stamp at the various stations. We will be offering door prizes as well.

B. Report: Goal Committee – Instruction

The Instructional Goals Committee (Owen – Chair, Schilthuis – Co-Chair, Farkas, Fountaine, Sherman, Patin, Lathrop, Tanis, Sellers, Palmitier, Lanser, and Lakatos) shared an update on their goal process:

Instruction Goal #2

Establish a committee to review curriculum needs in the district.

Desired Results: Establish a yearly rotation to review the district's curriculum to ensure up-to-date materials are used regularly. The first look will be at the Social Studies curriculum.

Instruction Goal #3

Monitor the Science and Social Studies data.

Desired Results: Look for areas of improvement or achievement gaps between subgroups and determine a plan of action to address deficiencies.

Instruction Goal #4

Establish a committee to review and update sex education programs offered in the district.

Desired Results: Ensure our programs meet the needs of our students and comply with all state and federal regulations.

Instruction Goal #5

Evaluate the effectiveness of the service delivery model used by the resource rooms in the district.

Desired Results: Increase student achievement for special education students.

Mr. Owen shared that for Instruction Goal # 2, the KHS Social Studies Committee has narrowed down the curriculum options to two, and the Sex Education Advisory Board (SEAB) is scheduled to hold its first meeting on March 18. For Instruction Goal # 3, Mr. Owen reported that at the elementary level, additional science and social studies textbooks are being purchased for Kindergarten through 5th grade classrooms. The Curriculum Maps are also being updated to ensure regular instruction of these subjects. At the middle and high school levels, newer science and social studies curricular resources are being implemented, with a focus on delivering these subjects to English Language Learner (ELL) students. Additionally, new social studies curricular resources are being considered for purchase for the 2025-26 school year at the high school level. Concerning Instruction Goal # 4, Mr. Owen mentioned that the first meeting will take place on March 18. As for Instruction Goal # 5, he explained that a co-teaching model is being used for all high school students with IEP's in math, with ongoing monitoring to assess the effectiveness of the push-in model for special education math instruction. There is also an evaluation of the curricular materials used in resource rooms at both KMS and KHS. Meetings will be scheduled in the near future with special education groups to review these materials and determine whether any updates are necessary. Furthermore, a survey has been sent to the parents of students with IEP's in the district.

Mr. Muhammad and Mr. Patin provided an overview of parent participation during this spring's parent-teacher conferences, which were held on February 11 and 19 for the secondary level and on February 27 and March 5 for the elementary level. A breakdown of parent participation for this year is as follows:

- KECLE: 72% attended in person, while 28% participated virtually
- West: 87.9% attended in person, and 12.1% attended virtually
- SE: 90% attended in person, with 10% participating virtually
- Central:
 - 86.54% of the 3rd grade parents attended in person
 - 83.75% of the 4th grade parents attended in person
 - 53% of the 5th grade parents attended in person
- Middle School:
 - 6th Grade: 68% attended in person
 - 7th Grade: 41% attended in person
 - 8th Grade: 50% attended in person
- High School:
 - 9th Grade: 25.64% attended in person
 - 10th Grade: 47.4% attended in person
 - 11th Grade: 28.44% attended in person
 - 12th Grade: 7.25 attended in person
- 54th Street: 19.3% attended

It was noted that in-person attendance typically tends to be lower in the spring.

OTHER MATTERS –

Mr. Alston expressed his gratitude to the retirees; Mr. Caterino, Mr. Schilthuis and Mrs. Farkas. Collectively they have over 100 years of experience at Kelloggsville! He appreciates all of their time and service and shared that they will be greatly missed.
