INFORMATION & REPORTS

A. Summer School Program

Mr. Owen highlighted the results of the summer school program. He shared that at the high school level (including 54th Street), 110 students were registered and a total of 84 semester credits were recovered which represented credits earned in all core classes. KVS offered virtual instruction with 27 students earning 22 semester courses gained back. A second session of virtual summer school is currently being offered with 10 students working to earn additional courses. The middle school offered summer instruction to approximately 75 students with a total of 54 students earning 179 credits. The program concluded with a field trip to John Ball Zoo. At the elementary level, 84 students enrolled with an average daily attendance of 76%. Many activities were scheduled over the course of the summer for students to enjoy along with academic instruction and support with an overall successful result for this summer's programs.

OTHER MATTERS

- Mr. Alston extended appreciation to the staff who were recognized for earning perfect attendance for the 2021-22 school year. He also shared that he is looking forward to working closer with the Board of Education in his new role as Superintendent and cannot wait to get started.

She also shared information on National Night Out, which will take place in many of the local neighborhoods the same night as the primary election, next Tuesday, August 2nd;

- Mrs. Reidzans – extended appreciation for the efforts of staff to achieve perfect attendance during the 2021-22 school year. She also welcomed Mr. Alston and shared appreciation to the Board for their condolences extended to her family;

- Mrs. Tanis – shared that there is language being proposed in House Bill 5721, which would authorize sinking fund proceeds to purchase replacement buses. Currently, that type of purchase is not allowed. She also welcomed Mr. Alston and wished him well in his first year as Superintendent and extended condolences to the Reidzans family. She wished staff a restful and enjoyable rest of their summer break with their families, knowing that the new school year is quickly moving ahead;
